Policy on Admission to Nursery Class

Background

Redcar & Cleveland local authority is required in legislation (Childcare Act 2006, section 7 (1)) to secure free early years provision for all eligible children in the area from the relevant date following their third birthday until they reach compulsory school age.

This free early years provision is known as the Free Entitlement for 3 & 4 year olds. From September 2010 the Free Entitlement increased to 15 hours a week (570 hours a year) over no fewer than 38 weeks of the year.

This policy supports the Redcar & Cleveland local authority in fulfilling its statutory duties.

Nursery Class Admission Limits

Our school nursery class admission limits are: 39 (am) and 26 (pm)

This is set by the local authority.

Eligibility for the Free Entitlement

A child first becomes eligible the term after their third birthday.

A child born in the period	Will be eligible for a free place from:
1st April to 31st August	01 September following child's 3 rd birthday (Autumn school term)
1st September to 31st December	01 January following child's 3 rd birthday (Spring school term)
1st January to 31st March	01 April following child's 3 rd birthday (Summer school term)

We may admit three year old children to our nursery class earlier, soon after their third birthday, at our discretion, subject to a place being available.

If our school is unable to provide a place in our nursery class for a child as soon as he/she becomes eligible, we will refer the parent /carer to the local authority. A free place will be offered with an alternative local authority approved private or voluntary setting.

Or

If our school is unable to provide a place in our nursery class for a child as soon as he/she becomes eligible, we will refer the parent/carer to other local schools, which may be able to offer a free place until one becomes available in our nursery class.

The School Flexible Offer

Ormesby Primary School is able to offer parents/carers their free entitlement in the following way:

3 hours a day for 5 days of the week

The children will attend school for 15 hours a week over 5 days, by either attending 5 morning sessions (8.45am – 11.45am) or 5 afternoon sessions (12.30pm – 3.30pm).

Our school will consider any requests from parents/carers to take their entitlement in a more flexible way that meets their families' needs. If the request cannot be accommodated, the parent /carer will be referred to the local authority. A free place will be offered at an alternative local authority approved private or voluntary setting.

Over-subscription Criteria

In allocating places in our nursery class, children will be admitted in accordance with the order of the criteria listed below:

- (i) Eligible children in the care of a local authority
- (ii) Children aged 4+ who live within the defined admission zone for the school
- (iii) Children aged 4+ who live outside the admission zone but who have a brother or sister attending the school at the time the nursery child will be admitted
- (iv) Children aged 3+ who live within the defined admission zone for the school
- (v) Children aged 3+ who live outside the admission zone but who have an elder brother or sister attending the school at the time the nursery child will be admitted
- (vi) Other children aged 4+
- (vii) Other children aged 3+

When decisions have to be taken on prioritising admissions for pupils within the same admissions category, priority will be given to the oldest child in that category. The oldest children will be admitted first.

Access & Inclusion

It is our school policy that no eligible child should be refused admission on the grounds that he/she is not fully toilet trained. However, if a child regularly soils herself/himself, we may need to contact parents to come and collect their child, as we do not have adequate facilities for cleaning children up.

Our school will offer all children the opportunity to experience a challenging and enjoyable programme of learning and development, irrespective of ethnicity, culture or religion, home language, family background, learning difficulties or disabilities, gender or ability.

Staggered Intakes

Admission of children to our nursery class may be phased in over a short period at the beginning of the term in which they first become eligible. We will notify parents/carers of their child's confirmed admission date as soon as possible.

The staggered intake will be minimised and all new eligible children will be attending by the DCSF prescribed termly census date.

Admission to full time education

Attendance at our nursery cannot guarantee admission to the school when the child reaches compulsory school age. Parents will still need to apply to the local authority for a place at our school if they want their child to transfer to reception class.

Parents do not have to enrol their child at our school nursery in order to secure a school place. Places for full time education in our school will be allocated in accordance with criteria as described in the local authority Admissions Guide for Parents.

Policy Review

This policy will be reviewed bi-annually by the school governing body.
