School Uniform

The School policy towards the wearing of uniform allows our children to demonstrate their, and their families or carers, respect for our School, as well as help eliminate problems caused by bullying around fashion, money and taste. They help our children view their School as a community of equals.

All pupils wear uniform that matches Ormesby Primary School colours.

Our uniform is as follows: red or grey jumper, white shirt, grey or black trousers/skirt and sensible black leather shoes. If a child wears trainer style shoes they must be completely black.

All children, from Foundation Stage through to Year 6 are expected to comply with these rules.

All uniform may be ordered through a link to the official supplier (Price & Buckland) on the school website.

In order to keep costs as low as we can, we have an 'official' supplier.

Additionally, you are welcome to select un-badged clothing, albeit in the School colours, if you so wish.

What is not allowed at Ormesby Primary School?

Sportswear, including football shirts as well as denims, jeans and fashion clothing and footwear are not allowed.

Sports Kit

Your child must have a PE kit of red shorts, plain white T shirt or polo shirt (not a football shirt) and plimsolls or trainers, kept in a PE bag and in school on every day. An outdoor kit is also required during colder months; most parents add a sweatshirt and joggers, possibly some older trainers.

Please ensure your child remembers to bring their kit to School on Monday, to save you the inconvenience of you having to bring it to school for your child's lessons during the week. PE kits may be left in school between lessons.

Children having swimming lessons will also need a swimming costume (not bikini) or swimming trunks (not shorts) and a towel.

The wearing of all cosmetic jewellery is strongly discouraged, although older children may wear a watch and stud earrings. Arrangements should be made to remove earrings for PE lessons, tape may be provided by parents to cover these if removal is impossible.

Hair styles

Long hair should be tied back, and the School discourages some specific hairstyles, for example shaved lines or coloured hair. Please discuss your proposed haircut with the Head teacher before having it cut if in doubt!
